CHAPEL RULES & GUIDELINES FOR CONDUCT

Most Important:

1. The Blessed Sacrament must NEVER be left unattended!
2. Please maintain quiet reverence!

Before Entering the Chapel:

Please remember to sign in every time you come to the chapel, even for a visit. An attendance sheet will be located in the chapel.

Please keep the door closed at all times to maintain quiet reverence.

Inside the Chapel:

Please do not place anything on the altar, and do not move the monstrance or touch it. If you have flowers or other gifts, please notify your day captain.

Please maintain a spirit of reverence in Our Lord's presence. Adoration is a personal, most special time between the adorer and our Jesus in the Eucharist. It is a quiet time spent with God so each adorer can worship in a "one-to-one" union with Jesus, without any distractions.

Please refrain from any talking in the chapel unless you are reciting formal prayers with another adorer, such as the Rosary, Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Holy Hour of Reparation, etc. If there are other adorers in the chapel during your assigned hour, then please refrain from any prayer out loud unless all those present agree to join in.

Please shut off cell phones. Please do not use cell phones inside the chapel. A phone will be available in the chapel for **emergency** use only.

Please dress modestly. Please keep in mind that you are visiting God. Please, no revealing clothing for men and women alike.

- Nothing skin tight, no lycra (ex. bicycle shorts)
- Please cover cleavage (shirts and pants)
- No mini-skirts
- No revealing tears (such tears under the derriere in jeans)
- No short-shorts (Daisy Dukes)

No material of any kind is to be placed inside the chapel without approval. If you have something to donate, please contact your day captain. Also, nothing is to be taken or borrowed from the chapel without permission. However, the Church does have a lending library in the front. Those books can be borrowed indefinitely.

Emergency Procedures

There will be an electronic security panel on the outside entrance to the church. When the door is locked, the security combination for entering the adoration chapel is:

Under no circumstances are you to give the security entrance code to anyone without permission from a committee member.

If you need to leave the chapel due to sickness or any emergency, or if the person that is to relieve you does not show up, use the chapel phone to call your day captain. If you cannot reach your day captain, then call any of the Adoration Committee members. All necessary names and phone numbers will be posted by the chapel phone.

If an emergency of a serious nature arises, call 911.

Procedure for Arranging a Substitute

Your welcome packet includes a list of substitutes as well as a contact number for your day captain and all members of the adoration committee. Please keep in mind, however, that you have made a commitment to be with Our Lord once a week. Unless it absolutely necessary, please try to always make it to your Holy Hour. Of course, we are aware that unforeseen things come up in our lives, so with that in mind, we ask that you follow the procedures below to arrange a substitute.

1. Please call any substitute whose name is listed for the same hour you have. The person doesn't necessarily have to be as substitute for the same day, but try those with the same hour first.
2. If you cannot get anyone assigned to the same hour, try to call any substitute on the list.
3. If you are still unable to find a substitute, call your day captain.
4. In the unlikely event you cannot reach your day captain, call any adoration committee member and we will see to it that your hour is covered.
